The History of AAP

AAP was organized in Harrisburg in 1949 by a group of individuals who realized the need for an association of assessing officials in Pennsylvania.

The AAP's Constitution provides for the annual election of the President, President Elect, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and twelve Directors.

The management is vested in a Board of Governors which is composed of the officers and directors. In so far as possible, the Board of Governors is representative of various sections of the Commonwealth. ❖

Membership Categories

ACTIVE MEMBER:

All elected and appointed public officials of the various local governments within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania who are engaged in the work of assessing property for local tax purposes are eligible.

COOPERATIVE MEMBER:

Persons, governmental agencies, firms, companies, and organizations not eligible for active membership, if they are interested in the science of assessment and taxation and if they subscribe to the objectives of the Association, may apply for membership within the cooperative group. If such applications are approved by the Board of Governors, the said persons, governmental agencies, and organizations shall be eligible ❖
